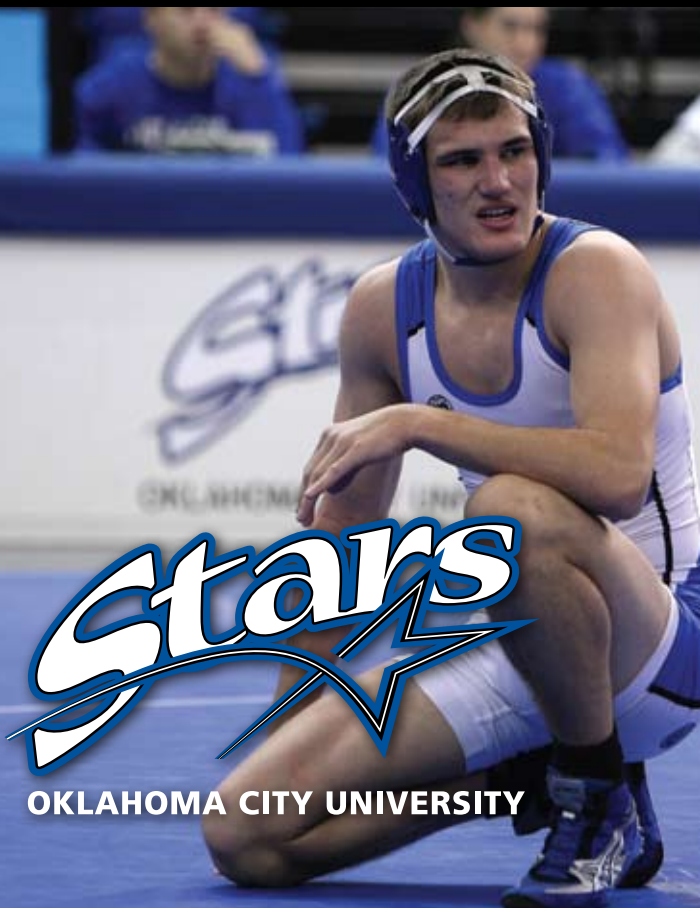

Archie Randall
Head Wrestling Coach
Oklahoma City University

Drawing upon his many years of experience as a former competitor and as a coach for wrestlers at every level of amateur competition, Randall designs his camps to meet the needs of all wrestlers. They develop athletes in all aspects of preparation to become champions. Coach Randall has produced champions at all levels. He has broken every high school coaching record in the state of Oklahoma. Randall's high school teams produced 21 state titles, 54 state champions, 52 state placers, 22 All-State wrestlers, and 44 wrestlers received scholarships to colleges and universities across the nation. As a jr. high coach Randall set the record at Jr. High All State with the most points to win the state title. He also qualified 84 wrestlers to the state tournament and won two division championships in his last year as a kids coach. In its first year of reinstatement under Randall, the men's wrestling team at OCU finished 12th in the 2007 national tournament. Eight OCU wrestlers qualified for the national tournament—three gaining All-American status. In 2007-08 Coach Randall embarked on a new phase of his career, launching the first-ever collegiate women's wrestling team in Oklahoma at OCU. In their first year of competition, the Lady Stars proved to be formidable competitors—several have their eyes on Olympic gold. Randall has received numerous coaching awards, including: Daily Oklahoman Wrestling Coach of the Year All Classes (2X); Oklahoma Wrestling Coaches Association Coach of the Year (7X); Suburban Wrestling Coach of the Year (6X); Daily Oklahoman Small School Coach of the Year (3X); NHSACA Coach of the Year Finalist; USA Olympic Committee Development Coach of the Year; USA Wrestling Development Coach of the Year; Wrestling USA Dream Team Coach of the Year; Daily Oklahoman Big School Coach of the Year (3X); All State Coaches Association Jr. High Coach of the Year; and Oklahoma Coaches Association Jr. High Coach of the Year.



Link Davis

Assistant Coach
Oklahoma City University

Coach Davis' was a varsity wrestler at Cleveland High School (Okla.) and was on the Cadet and Juniors National Teams. He wrestled for Missouri Valley College and the University of Central Oklahoma. In 1997 he became an assistant coach for Enid High School (Okla.) and was named head coach for Poteau High School (Okla.) in 1999. Davis also served as assistant coach and as head coach at Broken Arrow High School (Okla.) until 2005. In 2006 Davis served as assistant coach at El Reno High School (Okla.). His other coaching positions include Oklahoma Cadet Team Director; Head Coach, USA OK Kids Freestyle and Greco teams; Oklahoma Junior Team Director; and USA-Oklahoma Freestyle/Greco Staff Member. Awards and accomplishments: Oklahoma Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year, and USA Wrestling Coach's Achievement Award. Davis has led his wrestling teams to a runner-up and Dual State Championship, Cadet Dual National Champions and Junior Dual National Champions.

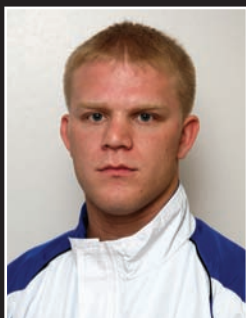


Wayne James

Coach Wayne James wrestled for OCU Head Coach Archie Randall at El Reno High School (Okla.) and finished as a two-time state finalist. He was also a two-time Junior All-American in Freestyle and Greco. James went on to wrestle at Lindenwood University where he was a three-time All-American and a member of the national championship team in 2002 and runner-up in 2003. He began his coaching career at Lindenwood and was a part of the national championship teams in 2005 and 2007, and runner-up finish in 2006. In his four years of coaching at Lindenwood James coached 39 All-American and nine National Champion wrestlers.

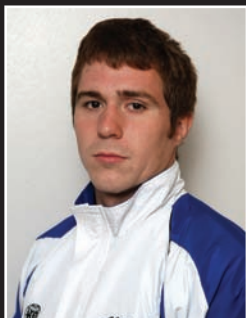

GENERAL INFORMATION

Facilities and Location

OCU Wrestling Camps feature some of the finest in the country. Campers will stay in college dormitories on the campus of Oklahoma City University and will eat in at the school's recently renovated "all-you-can-eat" style cafeteria. Each dorm building on campus has pool tables, television and snack machines.

Supervision and Rules

Participants will be supervised during all organized times and in the dormitory. Campers will be required to attend all assigned activities and instruction sessions. Those enrolled in the camp must comply with all rules and regulations governing conduct of the students on campus. Any violations or abuse of these rules will cause immediate dismissal from the camp without a refund.

We will use every precaution to prevent accidents. We do not, however, assume any responsibility for medical, dental, or other expenses incurred as a result of accidents. A parent or guardian must sign the application before a wrestler will be accepted into the camp.

Minimum age for resident campers is 13 years old and minimum age for commuters is 6 years old.

Health Insurance

Participants in all camps must provide their own insurance. Secondary accident insurance can be obtained by purchasing a USA wrestling card for \$25. No one will be admitted to the camp without a signed release and a given insurance policy number. Both must be provided on the application.

What to Bring

Bring your own bedding, a pillow, sheets and towels. Two people will be assigned to each room at check-in. Each camper will be expected to supply his/her own workout gear, shoes, shirts, shorts, singlets, etc.

Fees

Cost for the four-day camps in Oklahoma City is \$250. A fee of \$125 will be charged to commuters who attend the camp but do not stay overnight or eat meals. A commuter may purchase a meal plan for \$25.

Fees include instruction, room and board, use of all facilities, and a top-quality camp t-shirt. No refunds will be made except under unusual circumstances. Group discounts of \$10 per camper apply for groups of eight or more from the same school or club. Group applications must arrive in one envelope.

A deposit of \$50 is required with this application. The balance is due and payable upon registration. Personal checks will be accepted for deposit, but only cash or a money order will be accepted at check-in.

In consideration of being allowed to participate in this camp, I hereby RELEASE, WAIVE, DISCHARGE AND COVENANT NOT TO SUE the Oklahoma City University Wrestling Camps, the Oklahoma City University, the Board of Regents of the Oklahoma City University, and their officers, servants, agents or employees (hereinafter referred to as RELEASEE) from any and all liability, claims, demands, or course of action whatsoever arising out of or related to any loss, damage or injury, including death, that may be sustained by me/my child, or to any property belonging to me/my child, WHETHER CAUSED BY NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASEE, or otherwise, while participating in this Camp, or while in, or on the premises where the Camp is being conducted.

To the best of my knowledge I/my child am/is in good physical condition and I am not aware of any physical infirmity that would place me/my child at risk to participate in any way with the Camp's activities. I am fully aware of the risks and hazards connected with this Camp. I VOLUNTARILY ASSUME RESPONSIBILITY FOR ANY RISK OF LOSS, PROPERTY DAMAGE OR PERSONAL INJURY, INCLUDING DEATH, that may be sustained by me/my child, or any loss or damage to property owned by me/my child, as a result of being engaged in the Camp's activities, WHETHER CAUSED BY THE NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASEE, or otherwise. I further hereby AGREE TO INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS, the RELEASEE, from any loss, liability, damage or cost, including court costs and attorneys' fees, that may be related to me/my child's participation in the Camp, WHETHER CAUSED BY NEGLIGENCE OF RELEASEE or otherwise. During the period of the Camp, I hereby give my permission for the staff of the Oklahoma City University or this Camp to administer appropriate medical attention to me/my child in the event of any accident, illness or injury. I will be responsible for any and all costs of medical coverage and treatment provided not covered by insurance. It is my express intent that this Waiver of Liability and Hold Harmless Agreement Consent to the Medical Treatment shall bind the members of my family and spouse, if I am alive, and my heirs, assigns and personal representative, if I am deceased, and shall be deemed as a RELEASE, WAIVER, this Waive of Liability and Hold Harmless Agreement/Consent to Medical Treatment shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Oklahoma. In signing this release, I acknowledge and represent that I have read and understand it and sign it voluntarily: I am at least eighteen (18) years of age and fully competent; and I execute this Release for full, adequate and complete considerations fully intending to be bound by the same.

I HAVE FULLY READ THIS WAIVER OF LIABILITY AND FULLY UNDERSTAND ITS TERMS. I UNDERSTAND THAT I HAVE GIVEN UP SUBSTANTIAL RIGHTS BY SIGNING IT, AND SIGN IT FREELY AND VOLUNTARILY WITHOUT ANY INDUCEMENT.
